Programs/Courses

- **Independent Learning Centre (ILC):** students registered for ILC will have ten months from the registration date to complete courses. Students are encouraged to keep in contact with WALC, but will not be removed from WALC if a student prefers to work from home. However, maintaining contact with WALC on a weekly basis via telephone or email is recommended. WALC staff will monitor student progress via ILC. On-site teachers will be available to support student learning.
- **Re-Engagement Programs:** Co-op/PLAR/MPLAR/Maturity Credits/Credit Recovery are all on a semester system with Rainbow District School Board (RDSB). The first semester begins in September and second semester begins in February. To be eligible to begin any one of these programs with RDSB students must first demonstrate regular attendance and commitment to the program. Students who do not fulfil program requirements within the semester, will be recorded as a fail. A failing mark in one of these programs may result in loss of funding for future educational programs with the Sagamok Education Department. Daily attendance is critical for this program selection, and students who are absent for 15 consecutive days will be removed from the program.

Attendance

- Attendance is important and we must abide to certain agencies, and or Ministry of Education Guidelines. **The Ministry of Education stipulates that if a student is absent for 15 consecutive days, they must be taken off Nominal Roll.** Therefore, students are required to keep in contact with your teachers and submit work on a regular basis. Contact is encouraged to WALC staff to report on progress when unable to attend in person. Contact can be made via telephone or email.
- If applicable, a copy of registration will be sent to Niigaaniin (Ontario Works) after registration is finalized. The Student Learning Plan will also be provided to their office. Students are required to attend WALC in-class for a minimum of nine hours per week or 36 hours per month pending program of choice and program requirements.
